Student Support

International Student Accommodation, Arrival, and Orientation Information

For students coming for a full-year or terms 2 and 3 only, please note that a **sessional (or 38 – week) let** includes accommodation during the vacation periods. A **term-time only (or 30 week) let** requires students to vacate their room at the end of each term, as indicated by the dates above. Students may apply for Vacation Residence during the vacation periods if they are in term-time only accommodation and wish to remain on campus.
- **Free Airport Pick-up** service, offered by the International Student Support Office, can be booked online [Free Airport Collection](#) a few weeks before arrival (from Heathrow Airport only).
- The **New to the UK** Programme takes place just before the start of the autumn term and is highly recommended for all new international students to register. Accommodation is provided free of charge for the additional dates / for students attending this programme **only**. However, students are responsible for accommodation costs starting from the beginning of the academic year, as advised. A condensed version of this programme is also offered during orientation week in the spring term.
